Year 10 Work Experience: (Year 10)

Year 10 work experience has been launched and all Year 10 parents have been sent a letter outlining the procedure. The dates this year are **June 17 – 21, 2024**.

Year 12 work experience will be launched after half-term. The dates for this will be May 20 – 24, 2024.

For all students (in both year groups) interested in engineering, Sellafield's Engineering Centre of Excellence in Cleator Moor run a five-day Engineering & Maintenance Work Experience programme. Only 6 students are accepted for the week so there is an application process.

- National broadcaster Channel 4 runs work experience for anyone older than 16 who wants to gain some experience working in a media company.
- Similarly, internationally-famous broadcaster the BBC offers work experience taster schemes for young people in locations across the UK.
- The House of Commons offers work experience to secondary school students and young people over 14 and up to 18 years of age
