COURSE CONTENT	 <u>Why Religion, Philosophy and Ethics</u> Students will develop their knowledge and understanding of one western and one eastern religion and non-religious beliefs such as atheism and humanism. They will learn to construct well argued, well informed, balanced and structured arguments. Students will engage with questions of belief, value, meaning and purpose and their influence on human life. This course prepares students for adult life in a pluralistic society and global community. The course covers the diversity of responses to the following: peace and conflict; the origins of the universe, stewardship, environmental responsibility and sustainability; the sanctity of life, attitudes towards abortion and euthanasia and life after death; crime and punishment, forgiveness and good, evil and suffering.
ASSESSMENT	The GCSE full course is made up of all three components across the two years with two exams which are one- and three-quarter hours each at the end of Year 11. Paper 1 (50%) of qualification Religious, Philosophical and Ethical Studies in the Modern World. Paper 2 Christianity (25%) and Hinduism (25%).
