### Activity 1: Sharing nude images

- Read the 'Send me a pic?' Thinkuknow article <u>www.thinkuknow.co.uk/11\_13/need-advice/send-me-a-pic/</u>.
- Here are three scenarios about young people who've been asked to send a nude:
  - J met someone in a game. They have been chatting online for a few weeks. Now that person has asked J for a nude. J does not want to.
  - R got a message from someone they don't know asking for a nude. R does not want to send one.
  - L has been going out with someone they really like for a few months. Now that person keeps asking them to send a nude.
- Write down some of the reasons why J, R and L may feel under pressure to send a nude, even when they don't feel comfortable doing it. Check to see if any of the reasons you identified match those listed in the 'Send me a pic?' article.
- Imagine J, R and L are your friends. Write down the advice that you would give to each of them.

### Activity 2: Pressure to send nude images

- Read the chats between young people in relationships on the next page.
- Fold a sheet of paper down the middle. On one side, write down how you think N1 might be feeling after being pressured by BB to send an image. On the other side, write how J7 might be feeling after KS respected their choice to say no.
- Design a poster that could be shared with young people your age on social media about what to do if they're being pressured to send nude images. Include information about where they could go to for help (you'll find useful information in the 'Send me a pic?' article).
