<p><b>Dr Jan Boniface</b> (also a Governor of Keswick School LGB)</p>	<p>I have lived in Keswick since 1997 and have operated a tourism related business since then. Both of our children attended Keswick School and I have been a Governor for 17 years. My own background is in scientific research and telecommunications. I am a member of Under Skiddaw Parish Council and a Director of Keswick Tourism Association. My particular interests within school are around maintaining the breadth of curriculum, sciences and the sixth form including career opportunities for students.</p>
<p><b>Mr David Brown</b></p>	<p>I have lived in Keswick since 1980 when I began my career as a teacher of chemistry and physics at Keswick School. I taught for 30 years at the school and during this time had several leadership responsibilities in science, ICT, assessment systems and in boarding. I became an HMI in 2010 and led many inspections of schools throughout England, alongside being Ofsted National Lead for Computing and Online Safety. My final role before retirement was as Director for Standards, Governance and Safeguarding with the Northern Education Trust, a large Multi Academy Trust with schools throughout the north of England. I have 3 children who all successfully attended the school.</p>
<p><b>Mr David Hammond (Chair)</b> (also a Governor of Keswick School LGB)</p>	<p>We moved to Cumbria in 1998 and have two children: our eldest is at St Andrews University after attending Keswick School and our youngest attends the Sixth Form. I have a Mechanical Engineering degree and I am involved with projects through our family consultancy business. I have been heavily involved in the local community as a Parish Councillor and local fundraising groups. I was a Governor of the local primary school for 13 years before becoming involved in secondary school governance which has been very rewarding.</p>
